## News writing

**You will need:** a writing pencil, a piece of lined paper (or ask an adult to draw on some lines for you), an eraser (hopefully not too many mistakes though!), colouring pencils or crayons.

We always like to tell our news and write about it. I hope you had a lovely Spring break and I bet you got up to all sorts of fun, I know I did!

Tell your news to your Mummy or Daddy or older brother/sister.

Write the title **My News** at the top in the middle and the short date at the top right.

Leave a big space for your picture then write your news halfway down, just like we do in our Writing jotters.

Complete this first sentence then write me one more sentence.

Draw me a picture to illustrate your work.

- Things to remember:
- Capital letters
- Full stops
- Common words spelled correctly. (Remember you can use your word walls).
- Try to sound out your own words using your phonics knowledge.
- Write your letters neatly
- Finger spaces between words.
