### Literacy

Think of all the numbers in your life. Try to answer these questions:


- Age

### Health and Wellbeing

### Social Studies

Draw a picture of your house. Think about what materials are used: for example: bricks, glass, stone, wood. Label your house with the correct materials.


Draw or make a model to represent the journey you take on a walk you enjoy. Try to include all the things you see.
