
Numeracy

Complete the Figure Me Out task and ask someone in your family to solve it!
Who is the tallest person in your family? Measure everyone in your family. You could create a graph on Easimaths with this information.
On a big piece of paper, stand in the middle and ask someone to draw around your feet using a coloured pen or pencil. On another piece of paper, do the same with your hands. Keep it somewhere safe and every couple of weeks update it using a different colour of pencil each time to see how quickly you are growing! Remember to write the date each time!
You will all need new school uniforms by the time we get back to school! Calculate how much it will cost for a new school uniform!

The UNCRC

The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, or UNCRC, is the most complete statement of children's rights ever produced and is the most widely-ratified international human rights treaty in history.

All About Me



The Convention has 54 articles that cover all aspects of a child's life and set out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights that all children everywhere are entitled to. It also explains how adults and governments must work together to make sure all children can enjoy all their rights.

Health and Wellbeing

Taking care of your mental health is so important. When your mental health is not feeling at its best there are things you can do to improve your mood. Make a poster to remind yourself of all the things you can do to make you feel better. E.g. go for a walk, watch a funny movie...what else? Sometimes it can be easier to think of positive things to say about other people than think of positive things to say about ourselves. In the middle of a big sheet of paper, draw a picture of yourself and write the heading 'I am proud of myself because...' Over the next few weeks, add as many reasons as you can think of to be proud of yourself!

Expressive Arts


